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Emergency Shelter

Our Emergency Shelter program provides temporary shelter for families and single women experiencing homelessness. Those who participate in this program are seeking a safe, warm place to stay for the night. They can check in at 7:00 pm any day of the year. While it is first come, first served, residents can opt to reserve their spot by notifying staff of their return. Checkout time is 10:00 am the next morning.

Overview of Program:

- 26 Beds in 5 rooms
- Maximum 30-day stay
- Staff available 24 hours a day



Transitional Shelter

Our Transitional Shelter offers a long-term program for families and single women experiencing homelessness. Clients who participate in this program work with a Case Manager to develop an individualized plan that addresses employment/income and housing. Clients also attend life-skills classes about employment, health, budgeting, and parenting to work toward self-sufficiency.

Overview of Program:

- 78 Beds in 28 rooms
- Up to 9-month stay
- Life Skills Classes



Community Assistance

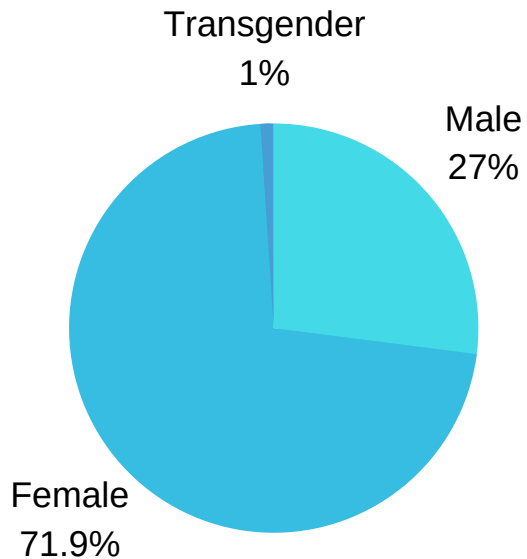
Our Community Assistance program is focused on serving those experiencing financial hardship. The program focuses on meeting immediate needs for tangible items open to anyone in our community in need, and includes all demographics. Assistance includes hygiene items, diapers, food, furniture, household items, and transportation assistance (in special circumstances). If there is a need that we are unable to fulfill, staff members refer clients to partner organizations. Individuals receive assistance Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.



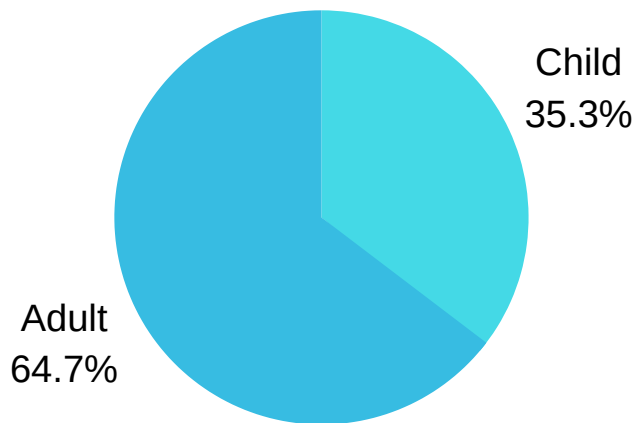

People served in 2022:

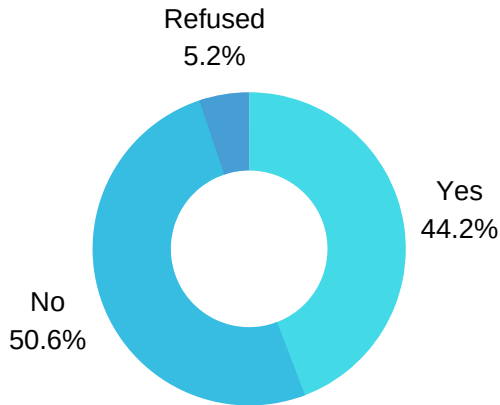


Breakdown of adults and children served in 2022:

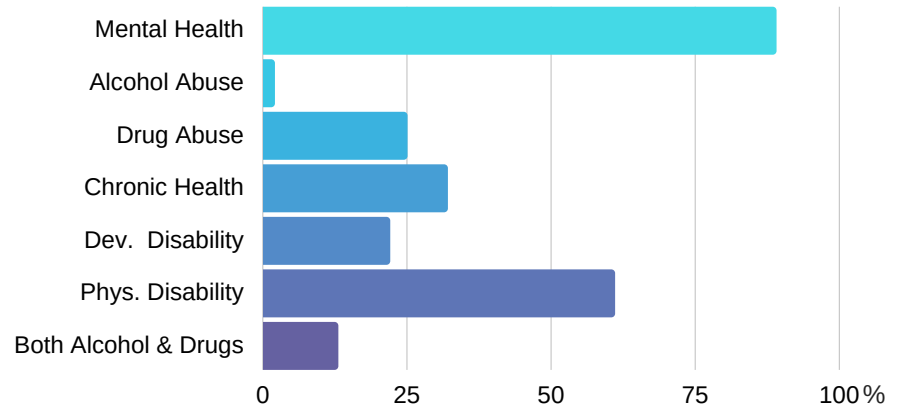

TRAUMA SNAPSHOT

The ACE questionnaire is ten questions in length and covers three main categories; abuse, neglect, and household challenges. The ACE survey is voluntary for clients. The data collected helps staff understand an individual's trauma history.

Those with **4 or more ACEs are 2x to 5x more likely** to experience: clinical depression, substance use disorders, suicidality, and chronic health conditions such as diabetes, cancer, cardiovascular and respiratory diseases compared to people with zero ACEs. Children living below the poverty line are 5 times more likely to experience four or more ACEs than those who live in financially stable households.

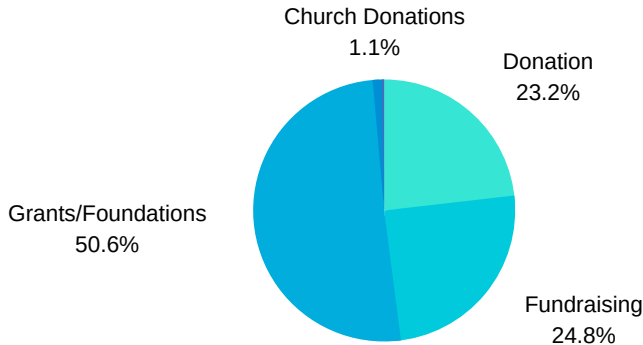

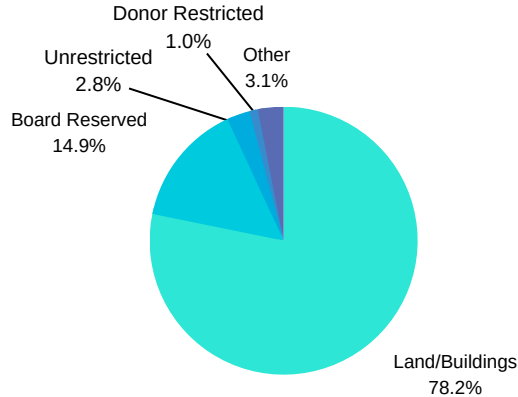


FY 2022 Monetary Operating Revenue:

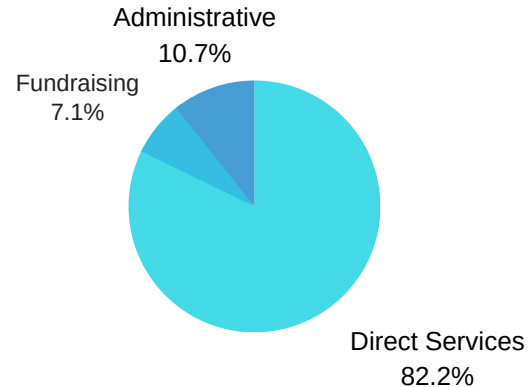
